

2020 Municipal Resilience Program Action Grants

- Bristol - \$222, 863
 - Completion of Phase II of the restoration of freshwater wetlands and floodplain at the municipally owned Bristol Golf Course for flood reduction and water quality improvement

- Little Compton - \$164,000
 - Elevation of the entrance of the South Beach Parking Area to alleviate the existing flooding condition due to drainage from the adjacent South Shore Road right of way
 - Installation of a drainage retention area at the southwest end of Town Way to collect and contain stormwater from neighboring properties
 - Installation of a detention area for storm flow drainage at the northeast end of John Dyer Road to alleviate large flow of water during storm events

- Newport - \$180,999
 - Removal of 25,5000 square feet of pavement and 12 catch basins at Sprouting Rock Drive, which will be restored to marshy meadow to deliver stormwater management and water quality benefits

- Pawtucket & Central Falls - \$400,000
 - Completion of upgrades to existing aged infrastructure and installation of green infrastructural improvements in the municipalities' shared Transit Oriented Development (TOD) District, which will provide stormwater management, water quality, air quality, and heat reduction benefits

- Warwick - \$225,000
 - Construction of a bioretention stormwater system and coastal embankment restoration at Oakland Beach for stormwater management, water quality improvement, and erosion control

- Woonsocket - \$300,000
 - Integration of a vegetated swale at the entry to River's Edge Park to capture water from the bluff and Bikeway before entering the Blackstone River
 - Introduction of rain gardens in low areas of River Island Park that would capture some of the site's stormwater before it can flow into the river
 - Introduction of a vegetated swale in the areas between the ball fields and the sloped banks at Bernon Memorial Park for stormwater management benefits
 - Installation of permeable paving, stormwater planters, gravel and sand filtration, and underground water storage at the City Hall Parking Lot for stormwater management benefits
 - Completion of increase in the capacity of a culvert crossing Mendon Road for flood reduction benefits
