

Clean Drinking Water Restored To Scituate's Rockland Oaks Senior Housing Complex

Last month we joined with representatives from the Governor's office, the Rhode Island Department of Health, the Scituate Town Council, and Scituate Housing Authority to celebrate the restoration of clean drinking water to the Rockland Oaks senior housing complex, which had been dealing with discolored and contaminated water since 2018. The project was made possible via a \$1.6 million Drinking Water State Revolving Fund loan with 100% principal forgiveness (i.e. a grant).

Infrastructure Bank Provides \$788,000 Loan to Bristol for Design of Multiple Clean Water Projects

Like many coastal communities, the Town of Bristol is experiencing more frequent flooding events that require increased wastewater and stormwater collection and treatment capacity. We recently provided Bristol with a \$788,000 low-cost loan from our Clean Water State Revolving Fund to move forward with the design and engineering of four important projects to modernize the town's waste and stormwater infrastructure:

1. Design of a Bristol composting facility
2. Rehabilitation of wastewater infrastructure
3. Improvements to Bristol's wastewater treatment facility
4. Elimination of the Ferry Road shoreline pipe
